Flooring

OPTIONS & -MATERIALS

Floor choices depend on aesthetics, personal preferences and budget specifics. Certain choices are deemed more practical for particular spaceslike tiles for the kitchen and bathrooms.

Engineered wood flooring, though a wee bit more expensive, is the preferred pick for many.

Hardwood and laminated floorings are effective options for living rooms and bedrooms.

Alternatively, opt for patterned terrazzo tiles or even a bohemian rustic red oxide floor.

The versatile tile emerges as the most widely chosen material when it comes down to colour, style and budget options. From tiny mosaics to large format floor tiles, to the latest "wood look" tile; in ceramic, marble or granite; tiles certainly do offer a large assortment of shapes, sizes and varieties.

HARDWOOD

Hardwood lends an air of regality to any space, making it a preferred floor choice for most contemporary designers and home owners. It makes sense to use it for almost any living room area and, in some cases, even kitchens and dining rooms. Hardwood goes down pretty quickly

and can be easily installed by most builders, although the glue-down installation is trickier than nail-down.

LAMINATE

Laminate flooring is essentially a low-cost alternative. It can mimic almost any hardwood style, from traditional favourites, like maple and cherry, to specialty types like wide-plank pine and reclaimed barn wood. Almost all types are designed for the quick and easy click-together floating-floor installation. Laminate can also be glued down, but this is rarely necessary or recommended.

VINYL

With a wider price range, more style and quality options, Vinyl is a desirable choice for hard-working and high-traffic areas like the kitchens, dining areas, laundry rooms, garages and bathrooms. Its durable and moisture-resistant qualities deem it a highly recommendable pick for many floors.

DESIGN TRENDS

Distressed concrete floorings are currently trending and can be integrated into most types of decor, but works best with the industrial-look or the contemporary design styles.

Hexagon tiles which were once relegated to backsplashes in the kitchen, or as accent pieces in the bathroom, can now be expected to find their rightful place in the living room, dining hall, and kitchen areas too. Clever placing of these tiles can create beautiful pattern effects in any room!

If the arty side of you likes to turn the floor into an art canvas by creating unique patterns under your feet, go for graphic tiles, repeating patterns or tiles that coalesce like a jigsaw puzzle to form one large pattern on your floor. Using advanced technology, manufacturers are now able to replicate an endless variety of images on tiles

TIPS

1. Measure the area: It is essential to get accurate measurements since flooring costs are calculated per square foot. Also account for accompanying materials such as cement, sandpaper, as well as the labour charges in your budget. If the lower layer of flooring needs to be removed or levelled, add that into the cost as well.

2. Factor in wastage: Whether you're doing it yourself or hiring contractors for the job, some amount of wastage can almost always be expected. To prevent unnecessary delays at a later stage due to running out of material, meticulously check the quantity, sizes, finishes and colours of your flooring material before starting the project.

3. Work in phases: Dividing your project into phases allows better management of the renovation chaos. In a two storey house, consider doing one level at a time. This method minimizes disruption to your day-to-day living during the renovation time. Working in phases also helps space out renovation budgets over a period.

OPTIONS & MATERIALS

If you are redoing the tile work, try a mix and match of tiles on painted walls. If you've got your heart set on those artistic designer tiles but find them expensive, try creating an engaging mélange by highlighting them alongside simpler ones.

Changing the counter top of the sink and the wash basin design can also make a huge difference to the overall look of the washroom.

When remodelling your bathroom, consider replacing just your toilet seat and lid to give your toilet a fresh look without having to invest in a complete new unit, cutting down on plumber and installation

costs too.

Swap the smaller details. Upgrade the light fixtures, sink faucets, towel racks and drawer pulls for a relatively small investment. These items may seem insignificant, but updating them can make a big difference in your bathroom's look.


Maximise the living area by combining family and kitchen space. A mix of lighting helps differentiate the areas, while a uniform wall colour keeps everything cohesive.






Extensions

ELECTRICAL WIRING AND SWITCH GEARS


It is imperative to use wires in the proper channels. Use conduits or concealed wiring, and case capping for surface wiring. This not only protects the wiring from damage but also adds to the aesthetic value. Joints in between the switch and load is not permitted as per the national safety code of conduct. According to the spokesperson of the KEI Industries, these joints become a major concern for wire failure, fire and current leakage.

Since there is an absence of any adhesive, planks can simply be laid out without damaging the floor underneath. Plank Loc allows for ease of installation, giving a seamless look to your floors that withstands the effects of seasonal change and foot traffic.

While hardwood flooring is made from one piece of wood from top to bottom, engineered wood floors are made of real wood and include multiple layers, with the top layer made of high-quality wood. Mikasa Floors come with a stable 3-layer structure to impart stability to the floors. These layers consist of a decorative hardwood veneer atop a core of premium quality HDF or pine wood. On the other hand, hardwood floors have a single real wood layer with a surface coating, making these difficult to maintain.

Engineered hardwood floors can be laid in damp areas, such as basements, where other floors would succumb to the moisture. They can also be laid over heating systems which would cause ordinary solid hardwood boards to dry out, shrink, cup and eventually buckle.

Is it possible to move the wooden flooring when shifting houses (in a rented house)?

Yes, it is possible. Since Mikasa comes with Plank Loc technology that locks two planks together without using any form of glue, one can simply take them out and reinstall them to the new house.

What is the average life of Decowood veneers?

If Decowood veneers are properly maintained, they can last for a lifetime.

Simple tips such as, cleaning regularly with a slightly damp cloth and wiping them dry with a dry cloth would help in increasing the life of veneers. In case you have any spills, immediately wipe them using a damp cloth. Dampen a microfibre cloth with water and squeeze it out. Always wipe wood veneer in tandem with the direction of the wood grain to remove any light dust.
