- Paint all the walls white as it will give your home a neat and crisp appeal. You can incorporate colour later in furnishings and décor pieces. For instance, you can splash bright shades like orange and pink in your cushions or curtains against the white walls to give it a warm and fun appeal;
- By including small planters in the home, one can instantly amp up the decor aesthetics as well as the indoor health environment. The use of greenery also provides a soothing vision with a pop of colour to the eyes and a fresher atmosphere;
- Rather than purchasing new furniture or decor pieces, upgrade the items you already own with stylish new hardware or paint.
